

Isaiah 55:10-13

## **Second Reading**


2 Timothy 3:10-4:5

But you have carefully followed my doctrine, manner of life, purpose, faith, longsuffering, love, perseverance, <sup>11</sup> persecutions, afflictions, which happened to me at Antioch, at Iconium, at Lystra—what persecutions I endured. And out of *them* all the Lord delivered me. <sup>12</sup> Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution. <sup>13</sup> But evil men and impostors will grow worse and worse, deceiving and being deceived. <sup>14</sup> But you must continue in the things which you have learned and been assured of, knowing from whom you have learned *them*, <sup>15</sup> and that from childhood you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.

<sup>16</sup> All Scripture *is* given by inspiration of God, and *is* profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, <sup>17</sup> that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work.

**4:1** I charge *you* therefore before God and the Lord Jesus Christ, who will judge the living and the dead at His appearing and His kingdom: <sup>2</sup> Preach the

word! Be ready in season *and* out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching. <sup>3</sup> For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine, but according to their own desires, *because* they have itching ears, they will heap up for themselves teachers; <sup>4</sup> and they will turn *their* ears away from the truth, and be turned aside to fables. <sup>5</sup> But you be watchful in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry.



## From the Pastor's Report

February 9th, 2025

**Psalm 122:8-9** – I have become a stranger to my brothers, And an alien to my mother's children; Because zeal for Your house has eaten me up, And the reproaches of those who reproach You have fallen on me.

The theology of the cross is one of the greatest mysteries of the Gospel. To believe that glory and salvation have been won for us through Christ's humiliation and suffering challenges general conventions of who and what we think God ought to be. God is all-powerful, all-knowing, and filled with love and peace. Yet God humbled Himself and became man, suffered rebuke and scorn, and was cursed, beaten, and nailed to a cross. Were we there to stand at the foot of Christ's cross, it isn't far-fetched to imagine ourselves joining in with the scoffers: "If You are the Son of God, save Yourself!"

Even more perplexing is that one of the results of Jesus' glorious triumph over sin and death is that we, His people, will suffer in this world for it. As the Psalmist writes, faith in God alienates and separates us from friends and family. Jesus said as much in Matthew 10:34-39. And the anger and disgust that the world has toward God and His Word is something that we Christians will also bear. This happens when our zeal for the LORD and our worship of Him, as the Psalmist says, consumes us (as it should). But this suffering isn't a bad thing, nor is it unexpected. In bearing our own cross, we are reminded of how Christ bore His for our salvation. In our suffering, the Spirit tests and strengthens our faith.

We can't change how people react to the Gospel, but we can change our response to the world's anger with the Spirit's aid. Like the Apostles, we can rejoice when we are counted worthy to suffer for Christ's sake (Acts 5:41). Like Paul, we remember that any present sufferings we may endure are not worthy to be compared with the glory that awaits (Romans 8:18). Like the hymnist, our song has been and will remain "All for Christ I have forsaken And have taken up my cross; Worldly joy, its fame and fortune, Now I count as worthless dross" (LSB 753).
