

Epistle Lesson: 1 Corinthians 1:20-25

Jesus, His cross, His suffering, death and resurrection, and our faith in these truths all looks like foolishness to the unbelieving world. But it is the power of God for salvation and we preach Christ crucified!

Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what we preach to save those who believe. For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men.

Gospel Lesson: Luke 18:31-34

As the time of His death drew near, Jesus told His disciples what was going to happen. However, this isn't what they had in mind and they didn't understand what Jesus was saying.

And taking the twelve, [Jesus] said to them, "See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and everything that is written about the Son of Man by the prophets will be accomplished. For he will be delivered over to the Gentiles and will be mocked and shamefully treated and spit upon. And after flogging him, they will kill him, and on the third day he will rise." But they understood none of these things. This saying was hidden from them, and they did not grasp what was said.

P: Blessed are they who hear the Word of God and treasure it!

C (sings): Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! These words are written that we may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

From there He will come to judge the living and the dead.

The Sermon

Text: John 12:20-33

Now among those who went up to worship at the feast were some Greeks. So these came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. And Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. If anyone serves me, he must follow me; and where I am, there will my servant be also. If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him. "Now is my soul troubled. And what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But for this purpose I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven: "I have glorified it, and I

will glorify it again.” The crowd that stood there and heard it said that it had thundered. Others said, “An angel has spoken to him.” Jesus answered, “This voice has come for your sake, not mine. Now is the judgment of this world; now will the ruler of this world be cast out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.” He said this to show by what kind of death he was going to die.



Pray for Laborers: This week, the President, Vice-President, and Conference Visitors met to discuss the current ministry needs in the CLC. With Pastors Barthels and Kanzenbach announcing their retirement, we have nine locations that are in need of pastor-trained men:

With one seminary graduate anticipated in the next three years and an aging pastorate, we see the great need before us. This is not a problem unique to the CLC. 11% of our CLC congregations are calling. This is similar in the WELS. The LC-MS is at 20%. Nor is this a new problem in the Christian church. 2,000 years ago, Jesus told his disciples: "*The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.*" (Luke 10:2) What can you do? First, pray! Let us hear and heed the Lord's call to pray earnestly for the Lord to provide for the needs of the ministry.
